



WSDA Programs Operated: EFAP (State), TEFAP & CSFP (Federal)

About the Programs: EFAP: (The) Emergency Food Assistance Program provides funding to pay for administrative, operational and food costs at nearly 500 food partities statewide.

TEFAP: The Emergency Food Assistance Program provides food and operational funds to food partiries and meal programs in Washington State while simultaneously stabilizing agricultural markets nationwide.

CSFP: The Commodity Supplemental Food Program provides a prescribed quantity of food for low-income persons at least 60 years of age in counties across Washington State.




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
